


## Thank You

## Civilian Complaint Function

In 2022, the MCBoP worked with MPD to establish the procedures under which the Civilian Complaint Function would operate.

Participating Board Members also took part in required County Prosecutor trainings.

Investigations are starting in 2023.

#### **Purpose**

Per NJ AG Directive, the MCBoP is able to review final Internal Affairs records. Our review happens after the department addresses the matter. Our work will focus on matters that involved a civilian and matters that rise to the level of major discipline.

The MCBoP has no power to change a decision made by MPD. Although the MCBoP's role is limited under the law, our hope is to recommend policies, protocols, and trainings to help avoid situations rising to the level of IA in the first place.

Crisis Intervention Social Worker

In April 2022 Marthe Eustache MSW started as Maplewood Township's first crisis intervention social worker.

From April - December, she handled 153 cases, including responding to EDPs (Emotionally Disturbed Persons), wellness checks, assisting those with trauma related to being victim of a crime. She has also been creating connections with resources throughout the county to help her connect individuals and families to services.


Success of the initiative and documented demonstrated need led to Maplewood Township budgeting for a second part-time social worker for 2023.

#### **Purpose**

Assist community members who are repeatedly in contact with the police in finding stability through de-escalation and conflict resolution expertise, and connecting them to appropriate resources.

## Communications/Outreach

The MCBoP created several flyers that were used at Mayfest and other events to help facilitate conversations on car thefts and gun safety.





## Training

In 2022 the MCBoP identified several relevant trainings including a non-academy-led training on working with teens and autism training brought to the MCBoP by a community member.

The MCBoP also successfully helped the department advocate for a significant funding increase for training, specifically designed for training on working with teens but will more broadly be used to continue educating on crisis intervention, communication, and working with youth.

In 2023 the MCBoP will continue helping the department identify trainings that support community objectives as well as work with community groups to lead trainings on managing difficult community conversations.

#### **Purpose**

The MCBoP is committed to supporting the Maplewood Police Department and all residents and members of the Maplewood community by identifying trainings that improve police/youth interactions and reduce disproportionate minority contact.
